



Some Specific reforms in Year are as follows:

Reforms implemented during 2022-23 include:

1. Implementation of the Competency-Based Medical Education (CBME) pattern for MBBS programs, conducting second and third-year Part I examinations according to NMC norms.
2. Introduction of a new examination pattern for semester-wise courses in the B.Sc. Nursing second year.
3. Exclusion of AETCOM (Attitude, Ethics, and Communication) questions from the first and second year MBBS examinations.
4. Adoption of a revised third-year Part I MBBS examination pattern, incorporating Forensic Medicine & Toxicology.
5. Introduction of revised remuneration for examiners.
6. Implementation of a revised examiner appointment process, involving eligible and recognized internal examiners not involved in practical examinations for theory assessment.
7. Launch of a new course, M.Sc. (MRIT), with the conduct of semester examinations.
8. Launch of a new Bachelor of Pharmacy course, conducting semester-wise examinations under the credit system.
9. Initiation of a new course, MPT (Sports), with forthcoming examinations.
